

# **AILET**

## **(ALL INDIA LAW ENTRANCE TEST)**

Established in 2008 by Act No. 1 of 2008, the National Law University, Delhi is a prestigious law university situated in India's capital city. The university provides Ph.D., LL.M., and B.A.LL.B. (Hons.) programs. The All India Law Entrance Examination, or AILET, is the admission test for this prestigious law school.

### **DATE OF EXAMINATION:**

The dates and times of AILET 2024 are December 10, 2023, from 11 AM to 12:30 PM.

### **QUALIFICATIONS:**

Senior Secondary School Examination (10+2 system) or a similar test with 45% of the possible points (or 40% for SC/ST/PWD candidates). Applicants may apply if they want to sit for the 12th standard annual test in 2024.

110 + 10 + 2 (110 spots on the AILET merit system; 5 seats each for OCI/PIO and foreign nationals for direct admission based on merit, 2 supernumerary seats for Jammu and Kashmir residents, and 1 supernumerary seat for Kashmiri migrants).

### **TEST-SITE CITIES:**

The cities of Bengaluru, Bhopal, Chandigarh, Chennai, Cochin, Cuttack, Dehradun, Delhi, Gandhinagar, Greater Noida, Gurugram, Guwahati, Hyderabad, Jaipur, Jammu, Jodhpur, Kolkata, Lucknow, Mumbai, Nagpur, Patna, Raipur, Varanasi, and Visakhapatnam are designated to host AILET-2024.

**TEST CHARGE:**

Interested parties must pay an application fee of Rs. 3500/- (Rupees Three Thousand Five Hundred Only) online in order to apply.

For SC/ST and PwD applicants, the application cost is Rs. 1500/- (Rupees One Thousand Five Hundred Only).

Applications from SC/ST categories who fall below the BPL are not required to pay an application fee.

**EXAM PATTERN:**

This year's exam pattern will be significantly different, according to the announcement.

There are now three portions on the exam, as follows:

English language in Section A (50 questions, 50 marks)

Section B: General Knowledge & Current Affairs (30 questions, 30 marks)

Logical Reasoning (70 questions; 70 marks) in Section C

The exam will last 120 minutes, and incorrect answers will result in a 1/4 mark deduction.
