Nestled in the lush green surroundings of the meticulously planned city of Nava Raipur, HNLU stands as one of the premier destinations for legal education in the country, attracting students from all across India. The University boasts state-of-the-art academic and residential facilities for its students, faculty, and staff.

Embodying its motto, 'Dharma Sansthapanartham,' which translates to 'for the sake of establishing the primacy of the laws of eternal values,' HNLU is committed to imparting quality legal education. It actively engages in teaching and research and aims to foster in its students a deep sense of responsibility to serve society in the realm of law, emphasizing advocacy and legal reforms. As HNLU celebrates its 20th year of 'Excellence in Legal Education' in 2023, it remains poised to reach even greater heights in its commitment to and contribution towards legal education.

HNLU is the sixth in the series of National Law Schools across India. The University is on the list maintained by the University Grants Commission under Section 2(f) of the UGC Act, 1956, and has been deemed eligible to receive Central assistance as per the rules outlined in Section 12 (B) of the UGC Act, 1956. Further, the university is recognized by the Bar Council of India under Section 7 of the Advocates Act, 1961. Notably, HNLU ranked 5th among the National Law Schools in the India Today Rankings for 2021, 2022, and 2023. It also achieved a rank of 51-100 in crisis management during COVID in the World's Universities with Real Impact (WURI) Rankings for 2021 and 2022, and placed between 201-300 among innovative and emerging Universities by WURI. The institution is geared up to set new benchmarks in the upcoming years.

#### CLAT Brochure 2024 Rules of Promotion for B.A. LL.B. (Hons.)

- There shall be no automatic promotion to the students.
- The students are required to obtain 1 GPA to pass their semester examination.
- The students will be promoted to second year even if they have not secured the minimum CGPA in the 1st year but they will not be promoted to fifth semester unless they have secured minimum 1 Grade Point in every subject of first and second semesters as well as cumulatively.
- The students will be admitted to the ninth semester only if they secure 1 Grade Point in their subjects of first, second, third, fourth, fifth and sixth semesters as well as cumulatively.
- If the students fail to secure 1 CGPA even after appearing two times (one initially & second repeat), they will be treated as year back students.

#### **Congregation of Minds**



An impeccably designed, state-of-theart University Auditorium, with its expansive seating designed to comfortably host 350 students, is a testament to the University's commitment to fostering a vibrant academic and cultural community. Throughout the year, its walls echo with the lively debates of academic seminars, the applause of award ceremonies, and the cheer of cultural festivities. This auditorium is more than just a structure; it's the heartbeat of the University, nurturing student talent and facilitating dynamic interactions between learners, educators, and guests.

#### **Moot Court Halls**



The Moot Court Cluster at HNLU serves as a dynamic training ground where students hone their advocacy skills, simulating real-life courtroom scenarios. Comprising six meticulously furnished Moot Court Halls, this cluster mirrors the authentic atmosphere of a court, ensuring students get a genuine feel of legal proceedings. These halls are the venues for various courtroom exercises, allowing students to immerse themselves in the practice of law, argue cases, and prepare for their future roles as advocates.

#### A 'Class' Experience

The University proudly features 28 state-of-the-art, air-conditioned smart classrooms, found in both the circular block and the new block, all equipped with advanced smart boards and LCD projectors. Additionally, there's a specialized 'Language Lab' within the University, outfitted with contemporary software and tools. This lab is tailored to enhance classroom instruction for language courses, aiming to refine students' communication and presentation abilities.





#### **Banking and Any Time Cash**

The University prioritizes the convenience and financial needs of its students, staff, and visitors. As a testament to this commitment, it boasts an in-house bank branch within its premises. This facility ensures that the University community can conduct their banking transactions without the need to venture far, saving time and providing a sense of security. In addition to the bank branch, there are two dedicated ATM centres strategically located within the campus grounds.

#### Halls of Residence and Dining Hall



The University also has spacious Halls of Residences spread across the campus with boys and girls wings. The Boys Hostel cluster called 'KAILASH' is named after the beautiful caves of Chhattisgarh and the Girls hostel cluster named 'VITASTA' named after the beautiful River Jhelum. Both the Boys and Girls hostel have a total of 629 rooms each spread across 4 separate sub-hostel wings.

The hostel rooms are fully furnished with a Cot, Table, Chair, and Almirah and every room also have a separately attached balcony. Every wing of the hostel has its own dedicated State-of-the-art Kitchen and Air-Conditioned Dining Hall. Each hostel wing has a well-built and advanced gymnasium complex and a common room with preinstalled cable TV for recreational activities. The hostels do have a night canteen catering late nights.

Each hostel wing and dining area is equipped with water coolers. The washrooms are equipped with Solar powered Hot Water facilities and the University also has plans to establish a centralized RO Plant in the coming academic year.

#### SAL – The Utility Centre

To meet the diverse daily requirements of its students, the University features a versatile facility aptly named the SAL - the Utility Centre. Encompassing a suite of 8 specialized shops, this centre is a one-stop destination for a variety of needs. Students can find a range of dairy products, an assortment of snacks and beverages, and a fresh fruit outlet, ensuring that their nutritional needs are well-addressed. Additionally, for academic and administrative purposes, there's a fullyequipped stationery store that offers not only essential supplies but also services like printing, scanning, and photocopying. Beyond necessities, the SAL houses a contemporary unisex salon catering to the grooming and self-care needs of the residents. To top it off, there's a picturesque



mini-restaurant situated by the lakeside, providing a serene backdrop for students to relax, dine, and socialize. This Utility Centre seamlessly integrates practicality with leisure, making the student life at the University both comfortable and enjoyable.

#### Learning Resource Centre

The Learning Resource Centre at HNLU is a well-equipped and comprehensive resource for students. With its diverse and rich collection of reading materials, including textbooks, journals, reference books, and periodicals, students have access to a wide range of sources to enhance their knowledge and understanding in various domains. The infrastructure of the library is a three-story building with a seating capacity of over 600 students provides ample space for individuals to study and engage in research. The availability of Wi-Fi connectivity ensures access to online resources and facilitates further learning opportunities. Moreover, the fully airconditioned and comfortable environment contributes to a pleasant reading experience.

The library's online learning platforms and interfaces, such as Taxman, Legit quest, Thomson Reuters, SCC Online, Manupatra, Hein Online, Westlaw, EPW, Jstor, Kluwer Arbitration, and Cambridge Core Journal, are valuable additions. These platforms likely offer a wealth of legal and scholarly resources, allowing students to access a vast array of information and conduct research efficiently.

The resources of the Learning Resources are also made accessible to the students through RemoteXs.

The inclusion of environment-friendly spacious lounges in the library at HNLU showcases a thoughtful approach to creating a conducive and sustainable environment for students. The design of these lounges, located just below an open-to-sky area protected by a transparent polycarbonate roof, allows for natural light to illuminate the space throughout



the day. This not only enhances the overall aesthetic appeal but also reduces the dependency on artificial lighting, contributing to energy conservation.

The presence of a lush green Amphitheatre, visible through transparent glasses from the library, further adds to the ecofriendly ambiance. The sight of a green, natural environment can have a positive impact on concentration and relaxation, creating a serene atmosphere for students to immerse themselves in their reading and studying activities.

It also houses environment-friendly spacious lounges which are just below the opento-sky area protected from rain and direct sunlight by transparent polycarbonate roof. Allday long, this area of the library is lighted by natural light. The lush green Amphitheatre visible through transparent glasses from the library creates an eco-friendly and aesthetic ambiance for the library users to concentrate on and enjoy their reading.



#### **Transportation Facilities**

The University provides two shuttle buses, each with a seating capacity of 50, that run every evening from the campus to the city center. These shuttles cater to students' and faculty's needs for shopping, dining, and entertainment. Conveniently, a city corporation bus stop is situated just 1 km away from the University, with buses operating at frequent intervals of 15-20 minutes. Additionally, the Swami Vivekananda Airport is a mere 15-minute drive from the campus, while the Raipur railway station lies 35 km away, ensuring ease of travel for those coming to or departing from the University.

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#### **Sports Facilities**

Both boys and girls have a state-of-theart Gymnasium in the central hostels with indoor badminton courts and table tennis facilities. Outdoor sports facilities inside the campus include a Football ground with a proposed synthetic running track around it, a Cricket ground, a Lawn tennis court, two Basketball courts, and one Volleyball court respectively.

#### Vice-Chancellor's Means-Cum-Merit Scholarship Scheme (VC-M<sup>2</sup>S<sup>2</sup>)

The Hidayatullah National Law University, Raipur has launched the Vice Chancellor's Means cum Merit Scholarship Scheme. The Scheme aims to provide financial assistance to economically disadvantaged but meritorious students of UG & PG courses of the University. The scheme will provide scholarship to the tune of 50 % of the annual fees to a total of 24 students of II to V Year of B.A., LL.B. (Hons) and 6 students of LL.M. every year for the second semester.

#### **HNLU Academic Assistance and Internship Programme (HAAI)**

HNLU launched the HNLU Academic Assistance and Internship Programme (HAAI) in January 2023 with the objective the students with an opportunity to learn beyond classrooms. #### Counselling •

HNLU places a strong emphasis on mental health support for its students and staff. Accordingly, it has provision of both online and offline psychological counseling services. The availability of a counselor on campus for offline meetings provides an opportunity for individuals to seek face-toface support and guidance. This can be particularly beneficial for those who prefer in-person interactions or require more personalized assistance.

#### **Comprehensive Health Insurance Policy**

Hidayatullah National Law University is the first amongst Nation Law Universities to implement an insurance scheme for its undergraduate and postgraduate students as part of its comprehensive Campus Health Initiative (CHI). The University has contracted with National Insurance Company (NIC). The Insurance Policy covers every student at the University. National Insurance Company which will provide a cover of Rs. 1,00,000/- for individual students. This covers cashless services in hospitals with consultation fee and diagnostic test as per the CGHS rates. There In addition to the offline counseling services, HNLU's collaboration with YourDost, an online counseling platform, further expands the avenues for mental health support. Online consultations offer convenience and accessibility to individuals who may prefer or require remote counseling sessions. This partnership allows students and staff to connect with qualified professionals and access mental health resources virtually.

is also a provision for additional buffer of Rs. 1 Lakh should be there for students, who may require above and over Rs. 1 Lakh as per medical exigencies and based on the instruction of the University. Cashless admission and treatment are to be provided throughout the country in your approved hospital/nursing home in every case with membership number/insurance card issued by the TPA. This will be mitigating the hardship of the student on emergency cash for treatment. The policy covers all diseases including Covid19 and its variants.

## **Beyond Classrooms**

Legal Aid plays an important role in the legal profession and HNLU through its Legal and Social Services Committee strives to ensure justice by furthering the right to be heard and enlightening the students about the practicality of the functions of the complex government machinery. The Legal and Social Services Committee, which is established as a part of the Bar Council of India's mandate with every institution imparting legal education, is formed to spread awareness on precipitating legal issues faced by the communities at large and also to provide avenues for underprivileged members of the society to resolve their legal issues on a pro-bono basis. The Legal and Social Service Committee which was established with this fundamental objective in mind played a crucial role during the pandemic and moved beyond its statutory mandate. Additionally, Pro-Bono Club has been established under the aegis of Nyaya Bandhu in the University.

#### **Research Centres** –

The University has restructured and redesigned its research efforts in tune with the contemporary priorities with its novel model christened as **"R- HaS"** {Research- Hub and Spoke}. The **R- HaS** constitutes Five Hubs structured as School of Law & Technology, School of Law & Public Policy, School of Law & Humanities, School of Law and Business, School of Law and Governance, Each School to have five centres of research.






## **Placement**


HNLU has created a record by placing its students through the recruitment
